2010 NTABL

The North Texas Amateur Baseball League is an all Wood Bat MSBL affiliate in Dallas. Known as the area's best, NTABL players expect the best competition, the best fields and the lowest cost per inning. 2011 will usher in new leadership as Gerry Mecca will take over as president from Sam Kayea. Sam will remain in a key leadership position as Umpire in Chief and League Administrator. We welcome 3 new vice-presidents: Rich Hildebrand – Open, Jason Bottenfield 25+ and Chris Cec 35-/45+. The league intends to expand using a National and American format in 2011 to provide a more occasional ballplayer access to the best fields and to include more 18+ players. The league has Open (18+), 25+, and 35+/45+ divisions.

HB Memorial Day OPEN Championship May 29-31, 2010

The Dallas Royals sponsored by Efren Navarro Construction captured the HB Memorial Day Championship over the DABA Barracudas. This tournament is meant to honor the legacy of HB Kernodle who passed in 2008 and was the foundation for North Texas Amateur Baseball and Reverchon Park high-quality competition.

The Dallas Royals continued their tradition of strong pitching and defense allowing only 7 runs all weekend. This team's depth has been an asset to the baseball club in winning the 3-day tournament that included 5 games against 4 teams from the Dallas Amateur Baseball Association. NTABL POSTSEASON

OPEN

The post season was not without its special moments. The fourth place Athletics upset the Royals and then took care of the Modoc in 3 games to take the Open division. Steve Nathan's A's claim their first Open division title after moving up from the 25+ successes in 2009.

In the final game of the NTABL 25+, the Blue Stars got the best of the Indians 6-3 behind the 9-inning complete game effort of pitcher Rick Burish. The Indians led into the sixth before the Blue Stars chased starting pitcher Brad Anderson. The Blue Stars and Indians "see-sawed" the whole season, trading wins early, and it looked like the Indians had tipped the scale in the 2nd game of the championship series with a big 11-8 win. In the final game, Dennis Sutton staked the Indians to an early 3-0 lead with a 2-run homer to right, and things looked bad for the Blue Stars. But solid defense and patience at the plate led the Blue Stars back as they scored 6 unanswered runs to take the 25+ title.

The 5-10-2 Diamondbacks came out of nowhere to win the 49+. After losing game one of a 3-game series to the Cubs, the Diamondbacks roared back taking the next two. After dispatching the Cubs, the Diamondbacks made quick work of the defending Phillies sweeping them in 2 straight.

Fall baseball returned to Dallas with seven Open division teams. The Sulphur Springs Pirates stormed on the scene winning their first 7 games.
